The Florida Center for Public Management (FCPM), and its nationally recognized Certified Public Manager (CPM) program is an integral part of the Askew School. The center's mission for over 25 years has been to effect positive change in the public sector by training leaders, improving public management, and providing organizational development expertise to state agencies, local governments, and other organizations in Florida and beyond.

The Florida Certified Public Manager (CPM) program is a nationally recognized, comprehensive training and development program for public sector managers at all levels. The Florida CPM program was one of the first to be accredited by the National CPM Consortium. It is designed to train public managers to meet the challenges of a changing world and it has been very highly evaluated by its clients.

During 32 days of training, participants are exposed to practical management concepts and techniques to improve their own performance and their agency's effectiveness. Graduates are awarded the Certified Public Manager designation after meeting the instructional requirements and demonstrating their competence through applied projects and exams. The CPM designation is a professional credential, not an academic one. The vision of the CPM program is to create reflective practitioners who apply advanced managerial techniques to real-world problems, and to foster learning organizations that use new knowledge to improve the way they govern.
